# On-Going

June began with LRAPA's purple air community meeting held on June 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm. The meeting was hosted on zoom and streamed live to LRAPA's Facebook page. 335 views were received on the platform, with 5 active participants on the zoom call. A goal of the meeting was to find residents in the Bethel neighborhood willing to host a Purple Air Sensor. We received 7 inquires of interest.

LRAPA sent a report of the meeting to the ECRCO office with training materials LRAPA plans to use and is awaiting feedback.

The purple air network continues to grow. As a result of our Purple Air meeting we are placing 4 sensors in the Bethel neighborhood. 3 of the 4 were recently installed, the final sensor will be at the EWEB facilities off or Roosevelt. Board Member Jeannine Parisi is working aiding in this process. 12 sensors have been delivered to Oakridge to improve our network there. These sensors are being brought online with about half already operating. The rest should be operating over the next week or two.

LRAPA published a letter to the editor in the Cottage Grove Sentinel, commending Cottage Grove's tree pickup program. The program provided a resource to city residents to depose of yard debris without burning it.

Outdoor Burning Season ended June 15<sup>th</sup>. A press release was sent to stakeholders and LRAPA has scheduled a July interview with KXCR in Florence to talk about LRAPA and our role in the community.

#SmokeReady2020 took place the third week of June. LRAPA made social media posts about wildfire smoke impacts on the community as we get closer to fire season. Informational posters shared health information of who is most at risk from smoke, ways people may protect themselves and their family during smoke. The social media campaign was in coordination with other northwest Air Agencies. LRAPA reached 1,088 people on Facebook with 56 engagements.

LRAPA's PM10 Grant memo is nearly completed and ready to send to Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ). Once June financials and invoices are compiled, the memo will be delivered to the ODEQ.

Good progress has been made on LRAPA's 2019 annual report with the goal to publish late July.

# <u>Asbestos</u>

Mail outs of asbestos informational packages to Lane County residents who received building permits for remodeling projects and new homeowners. Residents are directed to contact LRAPA with any questions. Residents of the cities of Eugene, Springfield and Coburg now receive information with their permits. LRAPA will keep the local planning departments and contractors, upon request, stocked with the fliers so that they can help get the word out to residents who might encounter asbestos-containing materials while remodeling their homes.




