## OUTDOOR BURNING LETTER PERMITS: 05/01/2021 to 05/31/2021

There were no Outdoor Burning Letter Permits (OBLPs) issued in May.

## ASBESTOS ABATEMENT: 05/01/2021 to 05/31/2021

During May, LRAPA received 46 notices of asbestos removal projects, 4 of which were schools (Triangle Lake School, Mapleton Elementary School, Kennedy Middle School and Gilham Elementary School).

#### **On-Going**

Public outreach and engagement remained a focus throughout May 2021 for LRAPA's public affairs department.

Public affairs participated in three community meetings:

- Beyond Toxics West Eugene Monthly Community Meeting Wednesday May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021
  - o Discussed LRAPA's summer public engagements plan
- Oakridge Wildfire Safety Night Event Friday May 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021
  - o Provided information on Purple Air monitoring and the Cleaner Air Oregon program
    - Heard community concerns and answered questions specific to J.H. Baxter
- J.H. Baxter Community Core Team Wednesday May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021
  - Listened and heard experiences and concerns from those living near J.H. Baxter
  - Presented Air Toxics Monitoring information and introduced LRAPA's New Air Toxics

Air Quality Awareness Week (May 3-7) was a success! LRAPA coordinated with DEQ & OHA on shared messaging and amplification of daily topics. LRAPA shared eight posts on our social media platforms through the week. On Facebook, these posts had a collective reach of 3,436, engagement of 137, and 53 interactions.

Public affairs continue to work on Cleaner Air Oregon public engagement efforts. Planning is ongoing for a large public meeting in June describing the CAO process. A second meeting, with direct targeting toward community members near the facility will take place in July or August on Seneca Sustainable Energy, LLC's Risk Assessment portion of Cleaner Air Oregon. LRAPA also met with Beyond Toxics on these efforts, with plans to collaborate with the group on community engagement moving forward.

LRAPA's Targeted Airshed Grant (Oakridge Air) maintains some of the Public Affairs department's time and attention. A community meeting in Oakridge described the need for a FireWise community in Oakridge and pointed residents toward Oakridge Air resources available.

LRAPA's Public Affairs and Monitoring Departments created a new webpage providing Air Toxics data to the public. The webpage highlights Air Toxics of concern in Lane County, shows sources of those Toxics, and monitoring data from 2020 to 2020. The Public Affairs department has devoted time in May, with more in June, to our application for the EPA's 2021 Targeted Airshed Grant for the Oakridge/Westfir non-attainment area. Time was also committed to helping Beyond Toxics' effort to submit an Environmental Justice Collaborative Problem-Solving (EJCPS) Grant to the EPA. LRAPA offered in-kind support to Beyond Toxics for this grant opportunity.







NO NEW ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS ISSUED: 5/1/2021 -- 5/31/2021

# ACTIONS PERFORMED (Enforcement actions issued prior to 5/1/2021 with subsequent action in the current reporting period):

- 1. CARD, TIMOTHY BRUCE (EUGENE)
  - A. Violation: failure to constantly attend outdoor burning; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (garbage bags, plastic containers, etc.); failure to conduct outdoor burning such as to promote efficient combustion; burning of construction/demolition materials without first obtaining an LRAPA permit.
  - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3831 issued 4/15/2021
  - C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2021-3831 (\$275) issued 4/15/2021 paid
  - D. Resolution: CASE CLOSED on 5/3/2021

# PENDING (Enforcement actions issued prior to 5/1/2021 with no subsequent action in the current reporting period):

- 1. JONES, ANTHONY R. (VENETA)
  - A. Violation: Failure to promptly extinguish illegal outdoor burning; outdoor burning when prohibited; outdoor burning such as to create a nuisance; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (grass clippings); failure to conduct outdoor burning in an efficient manner
  - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3818 issued 5/15/2020
  - C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2020-3818 (\$700) issued 5/27/2020: request for hearing scheduled and held on 11/13/2020; On 12/15/2020, the Hearing's Officer held up the violations however, adjusted the civil penalty from \$700 to \$600; Respondent has 30 days from 12/29/2020 to request an appeal or pay the \$600 adjusted civil penalty; 01/13/2021 Respondent request an Appeal to

the LRAPA Board; 1/14/2021 Respondent was sent letter with details on requirements for the Request for Appeal to the Board - Respondent has 30 days from 02/13/2021 to submit Exceptions and Brief, Respondent submitted Appellee's Brief 02/11/2021; On 03/01/2021, LRAPA's attorney submitted Appellee's Answering Brief; no Reply Brief was submitted by Respondent; the Appeal to the LRAPA Board of Director's is scheduled for 07/08/2021.

- A. Violation: Outdoor burning when prohibited; outdoor burning such as to cause a public nuisance or hazard; outdoor burning of prohibited materials; outdoor burning of construction/demolition debris without first obtaining an Outdoor Burning Letter Permit from LRAPA.

- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2020-3828 (\$1,650) issued 3/5/2021: no response, default order judgment in process for a lien on the property
