OUTDOOR BURNING LETTER PERMITS: 10/01/2021 to 10/31/2021

There were two Outdoor Burning Letter Permit (OBLP) issued in October.

- 1. Issued Special Letter Permit 20B21-10-02 on October 29 to Rainbow Mobile Home Park, 54655 McKenzie River Drive, Blue River, to burn 30 cubic yards of Commercial debris located at the same address.
- 2. Issued Special Letter Permit 20B21-10-03 on October 29 to Ross Good, 42566 Deerhorn Road, Springfield, to burn 30 cubic yards of Land Clearing debris located at the same address.

ASBESTOS ABATEMENT: 10/01/2021 to 10/31/2021

During October, LRAPA received 34 notices of asbestos removal projects, none of which were Schools.

On-Going

Fall Outdoor Burning Seasons

Fall outdoor burning se4ason usually runs through the month of October in applicable portions of Lane County. This year's Fall season was initially delayed by the Oregon Department of Forestry and the Lane Fire Defense Board until October 15th due to continued hot and dry conditions. A series of storms in early October prompted the opening of Fall outdoor burning on October 12th.

In response to a City of Springfield initiative to create a flowchart depicting all burning rules within the City of Springfield and Springfield UGB, LRAPA public Affairs committed time to crafting a similar flowchart for all locations within Lane County. This flowchart has taken the form of an <u>interactive PREZI presentation</u>. The PEZI presentation has been posted to our <u>Outdoor Burning Page</u>. This PREZI presentation is functional in its current form but will see improvements over time to make the information clearer and more readable.

Public outreach efforts

In October, LRAPA held a public hearing, at the request of interested parties, for Northwest Pipeline LLC. The hearing was held for proposed draft Air Contaminant Discharge Permit No. 205811 (ACDP 205811) and Review Report for the renewal for the Northwest Pipeline LLC's natural gas compressor station located at 85166 North Hideaway Hills Road in Eugene.

LRAPA, in coordination with partners, jointly hosted semi-annual meeting on Oakridge Air to share updates and progress with stakeholders. Oakridge Air will begin to move a second cohort of homes through the program this Fall. Delays are occurring due to supply chain disruption and rising costs.

LRAPA public affairs presented at a First-"Year Interest Group (FIGs) college course at the University of Oregon. This presentation provided an overview of LRAPA and potential career paths in the air regulatory sector and educational degrees helpful for such careers.

Other notable details

Work continues for LRAPA's redesignation request and maintenance plans for PM2.5 and PM10 pollution in the Oakridge/Westfir airshed. Time was committed throughout October to prepare for an Environmental Quality Commission meeting in November. LRAPA anticipates adoption of the maintenance plans into the State Implementation Plan before being forwarded to the EPA for adoption and publication in the federal register. LRAPA remains on schedule for the Oakridge/Westfir airshed to be redesignated to "attainment" in Spring 2022.

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




Air Quality Index Chart – Eugene/Springfield For: October 2021

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NEW/OPEN ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS STATUS REPORT

10/01/2021 -- 10/31/2021 Report of open and actions initiated since last report

NEW Enforcement Actions: 10/01/2021 -- 10/31/2021

- 1. ESSEX CONSTRUCTION (EUGENE)
 - A. Violation: 43-015(7) Failure to obtain an asbestos survey form an accredited asbestos inspector prior to conducting the demolition of a facility and 43-015(8)(B) allowing for the open storage and accumulation of asbestos containing materials or asbestos containing waste materials.
 - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3841 issued 10/19/2021
 - C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2021-3841 (\$2,200) issued 10/19/2021
 - D. Resolution: PENDING

2. WOODBURY ENERGY COMPANY EUGENE (EUGENE)

- A. Violation: The permittee failed to submit performance testing records to LRAPA which demonstrate compliance with triennial vapor testing requirements outlined in permit conditions 5.0. Permittee last submitted testing results relative to condition 5.1.b on August 8, 2018, and therefore is required to conduct equivalent testing by August 8th, 2021. Condition 7.1.c of the permit requires notification of upcoming testing be submitted to LRAPA and condition 7.2 requires test results be submitted to LRAPA no later than 30 days after testing has occurred.
- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3842 issued 10/11/2021
- C. Subsequent Action: Submitted Test Report for testing conducted on 10/17/2021 and signed NON.
- D. Resolution: PENDING

ACTIONS PERFORMED (Enforcement actions issued prior to 10/01/2021 with subsequent action in the current action in reporting period):

- 1. LANE COUNTY SHORT MOUNTAIN LANDFILL (EUGENE)
 - A. Violation: Failure to cover active asbestos containing waste materials (ACWM) disposal area at the end of each day that new ACWM is disposed of with tarp that is identical to, or equivalent of, materials used to cover active areas of the general landfill.
 - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3830 issued 06/17/2021
 - C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2021-3820 (\$3,900) issued 10/01/2021: request for reduction approved with a Stipulated Final Order (SFO) and pay \$1,950 along with the required conditions agreed to in the SFO 21-3830 to immediately implement verification that the ACWM disposal area has been adequately covered at the end of each business day; maintain a record of these inspections along with the dates and signature of employee for review upon LRAPA request; annually provide review of the Title V Operating Permit conditions specific to asbestos requirements to each employee with signatures and dates of the reviews on a form and submit these records along with the Title V Annual Report by March 1st of each year; 10/19/2021 submitted signed SFO, waiting for reduced civile penalty amount due by 11/18/2021
 - D. Resolution: PENDING
- 2. KUYKENDALL, ROBERT & DAVE COOPERS (FALL CREEK)
 - A. Violation: Outdoor burning when prohibited; outdoor burning such as to create a nuisance or hazard to public safety; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (plastics, metal cans, glass, etc.).
 - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3840 issued 09/29/2021
 - C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2021-3840 (\$600) issued 10/01/2021; no response, default order judgment in process for a lien on the property
 - D. Resolution: PENDING

PENDING (Enforcement actions issued prior to 10/01/2021 with no subsequent action in the current reporting period):

- 1. OREGON INDUSTRIAL LUMBER PRODUCTS, (SPRINGFIELD)
 - A. Violation: Respondent continues to operate wood fired boiler in such a manner as to cause the deposition of ash fallout on the property of other persons and has failed to correct the issue in a timely manner.
 - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3838 issued 06/21/2021
 - C. Subsequent Action: PENDING
 - D. Resolution: PENDING
