It pushes the anticipated timeline out a couple of weeks. Finalize plans for groundwork, platform and electrical infrastructure modifications - estimated February 23rd. Fabrication of platform, offsite contractor - from March 7th-March 21st. Groundwork and install footings, put up platform - estimated week of March 21st. Install equipment and platform, relocate power line - from March 28th to April 11th. Finalize ducting between new equipment and boiler – estimated week of April 18th. Startup estimate new system - April 25th). The structure for the equipment has been put up. The ID Fan arrived on April 15. Power poles are set for the overhead electrical feeder move. We are awaiting an update from our electrical contractor for service panel availability and delivery. Once that has arrived will schedule our shutdown to complete the install. (All dates subject to availability of equipment, contractors and sub-contractors.

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April 2022 Public Affairs **Monthly Summary**

On-Going

Smoke management from wood stoves, outdoor burning, and wildfires

Preparation for wildfire season is in full swing. LRAPA participated in the 2022 Smoke Management in the Northwest Conference to receive updates on recent policies, programs, tools, data, and resources related to wildfire and smoke management, with a focus on the Pacific Northwest. Sessions will integrate both forest and human health considerations, the impacts of COVID-19, climate change projections, the use of prescribed fire, communication tools, and public health protection strategies.

Public outreach efforts

Engagement with neighbors and interested community members in west Eugene on the J.H. Baxter facility continues. LRAPA, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), and the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) published a Frequently Asked Question factsheet to answer common questions and concerns raised through community engagement on the facility. In the factsheet, and during an early April Core Team meeting, LRAPA detailed what is and is not currently allowed at the facility from an air regulation perspective. LRAPA Public Affairs continues to work collaboratively with DEQ and OHA on public communications surrounding the facility.

Public affairs furthered efforts to strengthen relationships and coordination with existing neighborhood associations. Meetings and correspondence have occurred between the Active Bethel Community Neighborhood Association, Whiteaker Community Council, and Santa Clara Community Organization with the goal to utilize these relationships to provide air quality information directly to neighborhood groups on any number of air quality topics, such as wildfire smoke preparedness, home wood heating information, and public notices on industrial facilities.

In April, LRAPA was awarded a \$2.7 million Targeted Airshed Grant by the EPA to further air quality improvement work in Oakridge and Westfir. LRAPA successfully engaged multiple news outlets on this news. LRAPA presented at an Oakridge City council meeting to describe the Oakridge Air program offered to the community to improve air quality within the Oakridge & Westfir airshed.

Progress continues to be made on LRAPA's website redesign. Website contractors currently anticipate a website launch and in late June 2022.
