RE: 2022 Annual Citizens' Advisory Committee Report

Director Dietrich:

This 2022 annual report is filed with you as Executive Director for distribution to the LRAPA Board of Directors as required by Article VII-2. of the Advisory Committee Bylaws.

The Advisory Committee activities for 2022 are summarized as follows:

- Gas Powered Tools – As directed by the Board, the Advisory Committee researched the air emission issues of small gasoline powered tools and potential LRAPA responses. This topic was the committee's main focus from January through April, culminating with an informational flyer titled *Alternatives to Gas Powered Tools*, which was presented to the Board.
- Permitted Source Survey – As directed by the Board, the Advisory Committee worked to reinstate the survey of permitted sources that had traditionally been conducted annually but had not been done since 2018. The survey renewal was the committee's primary focus from May through October. The revised survey was distributed to permitted sources this month by e-mail.
- Purple Air Presentation – During the July committee meeting LRAPA's Public Affairs Manager, Travis Knudsen, presented *Purple Air in West Eugene* as part of the agency's public outreach efforts.
- New Committee Members – The Advisory Committee interviewed potential new members early in the year. The Board appointed the following new members in March: Peter Dragovich – Community Planning, Chris Cline – Fire Suppression, and Mysti Frost – General Public.

With regard to the anticipated activities for 2023, the Advisory Committee will start the year by collating the permitted source survey data and preparing trend data for the Board's review. In addition, the committee proposes to prepare a general public survey option, which would be available through the LRAPA website. As always, the Advisory Committee serves at the Board's discretion and looks forward to working on projects that the Board assigns.
