February 2023 Public Affairs Monthly Summary

Smoke management from wood stoves, outdoor burning, and Wildfires

Smoke management efforts through February focused on home wood heating curtailment during periods of prolonged air stagnation. Three yellow home wood heating days were called in February for Eugene, Springfield, and Oakridge. Air quality in these areas avoided reaching poor levels that would have required red home wood heating days.

Long range weather outlooks suggest a more active weather pattern through the first half of March. LRAPA currently is not anticipating a need for home wood heating curtailment. LRAPA also does not anticipate a need to prohibit outdoor burning based on meteorological conditions for the first half of March.

Home wood heating season runs through May 31. LRAPA continues to publish daily Home Wood Heating advisories for Eugene/Springfield and Oakridge. During the season LRAPA prioritizes staff time to assess potential air stagnation episodes and the need for Yellow/Red advisory days during those episodes.

The spring outdoor burning season begins March 1 and continues through July 15, unless curtailed by the Oregon Department of Forestry or Lane Fire Defense Board based on current fire danger conditions. LRAPA will publish daily burning status advisories on our website throughout the duration of the season.

LRAPA staff participated on the Rivers to Ridges (R2R) ecological prescribed fire planning discussion in February. This coordination is in anticipation of an outdoor burn letter permit application from the R2R group to conduct ecological prescribed burning in 2023.

Public outreach efforts

LRAPA's 2022 annual report was published on January 30, 2023. This publication highlights work, and accomplishments achieve throughout the year. New with the 2022 year, an online version of the report presented in an ArcGis StoryMap. The intent of producing this online version of the report is to encourage more Lane County residents to see, interact with, and read the report. This report can be easily found and accessed from LRAPA's Community Center webpage. Throughout February, LRAPA mailed printed copies and distributed virtual copies to partners interested bodies.
