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June 2022 Public Affairs **Monthly Summary** On-Going

Smoke management from wood stoves, outdoor burning, and wildfires

LRAPA coordinated with the Lane County Fire Defense Board and Oregon Department of Forestry on the closure of the spring outdoor burning season on Wednesday, June 15 in accordance with Title 47 of LRAPA's rules. The agency received phone calls from residents frustrated by the closure despite the wet spring weather. Many suggested LRAPA's rules be changed for the season to remain open until the Lane County Fire Defense Board or Oregon Department of Forestry close the season due to wildfire danger. To promote wildfire smoke awareness and readiness, LRAPA worked with the Northwest Air Quality Communicators Group (which is a consortium of communicators from federal, state, provincial, tribal, local air quality, and health agencies) to share smoke and air quality informational resources during "Smoke Ready Week" which ran from June 13 -June 17. LRAPA crafted social media images and posts which were shared with the Northwest Air Quality Communicators group to use on their own platforms. LRAPA also made use of other materials provided to the group. LRAPA indented to participate in the "Fire Safety Night" in Oakridge to promote Firewise effort and educate community members on air quality issues related to both wildfires and wood stoves. This even was scheduled for June 3 but was postponed due to heavy rain. The new date is July 14th, and LRAPA plans to participate.

Public outreach efforts

Engagement with neighbors and interested community members in west Eugene on the J.H. Baxter facility continues. LRAPA, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), and City of Eugene met with the Core Team in June to share updates on the facility. LRAPA detailed J.H. Baxter's process water treatment system and how the facility evaporates rainwater that falls into containment areas. LRAPA was invited to host a booth at "Bethel Summer Fun" events happening throughout June and July. LRAPA participated on June 2 and hosted a booth at State Street Park. Heavy rain limited turnout at the booth, but LRAPA staff shared information with a handful of residents. LRAPA will be holding a booth on July 2 at Grasshopper Meadows Park, the forecast is much sunnier. LRAPA presented at the Active Bethel Community neighborhood association on June 15 on the public participation and commenting process. This is an effort to inform the community how to make substantive public comments on LRAPA actions open for public comment. Substantial efforts were focus on preparing for a hybrid in-person and virtual public hearing for Seneca Sustainable Energy, LLC. Progress continues to be made on LRAPA's website redesign. Website contractors currently anticipate a website launch in the summer of 2022.
