1. MID-STATE INDUSTRIAL SERVICE, INC. (COTTAGE GROVE) 32910 SAGINAW ROAD

- A. Violation: Failure to take reasonable precautions to prevent particulate matter from becoming airborne. Operated paved surface sweeper without utilizing water sprays.
- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3869 issued 09/13/2022
- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2022-3869 (\$750) issued 09/19/2022
- D. Resolution: PENDING

2. CHRISTIANSEN, MICHAEL (CRESWELL) 33830 ORCHARD AVENUE

- Violation: Failure to attend outdoor burning until extinguished; failure to promptly extinguish illegal outdoor burning; outdoor burning when prohibited; outdoor burning such as to create a nuisance or hazard to public safety; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (clothing, wiring, paper products, garbage)

1. OREGON INDUSTRIAL LUMBER PRODUCTS (SPRINGFIELD) 3950 MARCOLA ROAD

- A. Violation: Respondent continues to operate wood fired boiler in such a manner as to cause the deposition of ash fallout on the property of other persons and has failed to correct the issue in a timely manner.

Initial Action Taken: NON #3838 issued 6/21/2021; the week of 7/4/2022 through 7/12/2022 planned install of multiclone and ID fan; 6/27/2022 update with planning to shut down for the equipment install on July 1st. Estimated startup with the multiclone in place on July 12th. On 07/15/2022 LRAPA affirmed the equipment was installed and operational.

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- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2021-3838 (\$3,200) issued 08/15/2022- paid
- D. Resolution: CASE CLOSED on 09/21/2022

2. JOHNSON, CHRIS & JULIE RENFRO (COTTAGE GROVE) 30579 KENADY LANE

- A. Violation: Outdoor burning such as to create a nuisance; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (household garbage); conducting outdoor burning in barrels
- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3855 issued 04/06/2022
- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2022-3855 (\$375) issued 06/27/2022: NCP returned, reissued 6/27/2022 and served 8/8/2022; no response, default order judgment filed for a lien on the property filed with Lane County 9/16/2022
- D. Resolution: CASE CLOSED on 09/16/2022
- 3. WEYBRIGHT, BROGAN; MICHELLE L WEYBRIGHT (COTTAGE GROVE) Tax Lot #20-03-28-14-00200
 - A. Violation: Failure to obtain an asbestos survey from an accredited asbestos inspector prior to conducting the demolition of a facility; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (roofing shingles/tar paper, vinyl, drywall, metal, etc); burning construction/demolition waste without first obtaining an LRAPA letter permit.
 - B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3859 issued 07/19/2022
 - C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2022-3859 (\$5,175) issued 07/22/2022: request for hearing was past the 21 days and denied and no payment was received or request for reduction; default order judgment for a lien on the property filed with Lane County 9/22/2022
 - D. Resolution: CASE CLOSED on 09/22/2022

4. ADAMS, DANNY (OAKRIDGE) 47614 RIVERVIEW STREET

A. Violation: Failure to abide by asbestos abatement notification and fee requirements; failure to abide by asbestos abatement negative pressure enclosure requirements; failure to adequately wet asbestos containing material; failure to adequately clean project area at conclusion of abatement project; failure to secure asbestos containing waste at project site; open storage of asbestos containing waste; conducting an asbestos abatement without possessing a current license or certification; failure to abide by friable asbestos disposal requirements;

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B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3867 issued 08/29/2022

C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2022-3867 (\$12,000) issued 09/16/2022

D. Resolution: PENDING

1. BASARABA, DANIEL (CRESWELL) 82671/82645 HOWE LANE

- A. Violation: failure to attend outdoor burning until extinguished; failure to promptly extinguish illegal outdoor burning; outdoor burning when prohibited; outdoor burning such as to create a nuisance or hazard to public safety; outdoor burning of prohibited materials (wiring, aerosol cans, materials that emit noxious odors when outdoor burned); failure to conduct outdoor burning in an efficient manner; outdoor burning of construction/demolition wastes without first obtaining a letter permit issued by LRAPA. LRAPA Title 47 "Outdoor Burning" enclosed; Respondent may submit to LRAPA in writing, within 15 days of receipt of NON 3845, an account of the events pertaining to the allegations expressed in the "Violations(s) description:" section of NON 3845.
- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3845 issued 11/29/2021
- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2021-3845 (\$6,813) issued 06/15/2022: request for hearing received 7/7/2022, scheduling on hold due to negotiations of settlement
- D. Resolution: PENDING

2. FORREST PAINT COMPANY (EUGENE) 1011 MCKINLEY STREET

- A. Violation: Failure to operate and maintain the air contaminant collection unit, biofilter, in a manner which minimizes air contaminant discharges, and failure to update the biofilter Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Plan once knowledge was acquired of insufficient maintenance and parametric data monitoring was discovered to ensure the biofilter is operated at the highest reasonable efficiency and effectiveness.
- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3860 issued 06/22/2022
- C. Subsequent Action: Submitting status reports biweekly.
- D. Resolution: PENDING

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3. BASARABA, DANIEL (CRESWELL) 82671/82645 HOWE LANE

A. Violation: Failure to obtain an asbestos survey from an accredited asbestos inspector prior to conducting the demolition of a facility at: 82671/82645 Howe Lane, Creswell, OR, 97426. Respondent may submit to LRAPA in writing, within 15 days of receipt of NON 3861, an account of the events pertaining to the allegations expressed in the "Violations(s) description:" section of NON 3861.

- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3861 issued 06/24/2022
- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2022-3861 (\$5,000) issued 08/08/2022: request for reduction under review and pending negotiation for settlement
- D. Resolution: PENDING

4. THABET MANAGEMENT –BARGER 005 (EUGENE) 1700 BARGER DRIVE

- A. Violation: The permittee failed to submit in a timely manner performance testing records to LRAPA which demonstrate compliance with triennial vapor testing requirements outlined in permit conditions 5.1.a and 5.1.b. Prior test results relative to conditions 5.1.a and 5.1.b were submitted to LRAPA for testing conducted on May 10th, 2019. Permittee submitted test results relative to conditions 5.1.a and 5.1.b for testing conducted on July 11th, 2022, however, testing was required to have been conducted no later than May 10th, 2022.
- B. Initial Action Taken: NON #3864 issued 08/04/2022
- C. Subsequent Action: NCP #2022-3864 (\$2,250) issued 08/05/2022: no response, default order judgment in process for a lien on the property
- D. Resolution: PENDING

5. AMERICAN LAMINATORS (SWISSHOME) 12796 HWY 36

- A. Violation: Permit Condition 9 Exceeded 20% opacity as a six-minute block average from wood fired boiler.

6. JOOSSE, BRANDON (COTTAGE GROVE) 842 CHESTNUT AVENUE

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September 2022 Public Affairs Monthly Summary

Smoke management from wood stoves, outdoor burning, and wildfires

Air quality continued to be dramatically affected by the Cedar Creek wildfire burning near Oakridge. Air quality in Oakridge and Westfir has been "hazardous" on the Air Quality Index (AQI) at times. Wildland firefighters anticipate the Cedar Creek fire to continue to produce smoke until widespread rain returns with Oregon's seasonal weather change. Until that rain arrives, smoke is anticipated to frequently diminish air quality in Oakridge and Westfir. Smoke may occasionally reduce air quality in the Eugene/Springfield area. LRAPA has an ongoing air quality advisory in effect for eastern Lane County due to the Cedar Creek Fire. LRAPA continues to participate on the cooperator meetings for the Cedar Creek Fire. Cooperator meetings are designed to share information on fire activity and suppression, describe the expected fire intensity and smoke production for the day, and review the air quality outlook for surrounding Smoke Sensitive Receptor Areas (SSRAs).

The Lane County Fire Defense Board has delayed the fall outdoor burning season. By rule the Season opens on October 1, however the fire defense board has delayed the opening until October 15 due to elevated fire concerns in Lane County.

Attainment designation

The Oakridge-Westfir redesignation from nonattainment to attainment for National Ambient Air Quality Standards has been approved by the EPA and signed by EPA's Region 10 administrator. The change took effect on September 21, 2022. LRAPA and the EPA published a joint press release at the end of September highlighting this accomplishment.

Public outreach efforts

LRAPA successfully launched the new website on Thursday, September 15. The new website provides more direct access to air quality data, daily burn notices, industry permitting information, an improved public calendar, and a community center connecting to additional resources.

LRAPA is collecting and assessing feedback of the site's usability and functionality to implement future changes that will improve the site's serviceability.

Public Meetings, Hearings, and Events

Engagement with neighbors and interested community members in west Eugene on the J.H. Baxter facility continues. LRAPA, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), and City of Eugene met with the Core Team in September to share updates on the facility.
